ASB Community Trigger

The Community Trigger is a mechanism available to the public which they can use to ask agencies such as the local authority, police and housing providers to review collectively how they have responded to complaints of antisocial behaviour.

If you have reported an incident 3 or more times within a 6 month period and not received a satisfactory response, you can activate the Community Trigger. This gives you the right to ask for agencies to deal with persistent anti-social behaviour.

Various agencies, usually the local authority, police, housing associations and the NHS, will set up a multi-agency case review. The Community Trigger process is more of an attempt to ultimately fix the problem and stop the anti-social behaviour.
