Pause works with women who have experienced, or are at risk of, repeat removals of children from their care. It aims to break this cycle and give women the opportunity to develop new skills and responses that can help them create a more positive future. To do this they are required to take LARC (long acting reversible contraception) during the intervention, thereby creating a space to pause, reflect, learn and aspire.
